- January or May Intersession classes and/or travel interim courses may be used to reduce the total number of credits in a given semester.
- General electives may include any courses in the student's area of interest. Students may complete additional communication coursework, a minor program of study, or a second major concentration.
- Recommended general elective courses include: ENGL 381; ENTR 307, 309, 311; PHIL 201, 211; PSYC 101, 201, 208; MNGT 307; HIST 333, 417, 418.
- Communication Arts majors are encouraged to participate actively in two or more media-related campus organizations such as theatre, newspaper, yearbook, television news, and radio during their program of studies.
- COMM 480 Communication Internship is encouraged for those students who qualify.

Note: No college credits are earned when a student receives a language waiver. When a waiver is earned, the credits currently assigned to foreign language study must be fulfilled through general electives of the student's choosing.
