MNGT 302, 424, and three hours from MNGT 311, 325, 450, 457, 480, or INBS 417.

Software (9hrs):

Nine hours from COMP 222 or higher COMP courses and/or any DSCI courses.

Sports Management (9hrs):

MNGT 213, and six hours from MNGT 313, 325, 480 (max. 3 hours, must be sports analytics oriented), EXER 201 or 305.

**Students who successfully complete the requirements of a second major in Accounting, Business Economics, Computer Science, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, International Business, Management, Marketing, or Mathematics are exempt from the Business Analysis Concentration requirement.
