1. JUNIOR YEAR or SEMESTER ABROAD requires alternate planning, which must be done well in advance.
  2. EDUC 307 is only offered fall semester; FREN 362 is only offered spring semester.
  3. Student teaching may be either in the first or second semester; when possible, make either semester of senior year available for student teaching. All EDUC courses with the exception of EDUC 488, must be completed prior to student teaching.

**Essential information:** French 101-102 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. The French major with K-12 certification requires 32 credit hours of French beyond the elementary level. A student with prior experience in French should begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.
