We believe that this requirement helps to promote a high level of cultural literacy and communication skills that are necessary in order for students to serve and lead in a global context. Note that Latin is rarely offered at GCC; however, a Latin proficiency assessment is available. Assessments are also available in other languages not offered at GCC; note that these may be at the expense of th student. For students in degrees with a language requirement, placement assessment is required within the first year of matriculation so that students can plan their degree path appropriately. You are encouraged to start language coursework in your first year.		
STUDIES IN SCIENCE, FAITH, & TECHNOLOGY				The standard for determining the language course for each student is based on the following: 1. Students who have studied same modern, widely-spoken modern language for three years in high school with a "B" average or better are exempt from further language study. 2. Students who have studied less than three years of a modern, widely spoken foreign language language in high school with a "B" average or better will need to take the language placement exam to determine your proper starting course. Exam information can be found on the Modern Language Department's website. Upon successful completion of the course sequence (in the same language) required for their degree, the student will have met the language requirement. 3. Students who have studied the same classical language for two to three or more years in high school with a "B" average or better can fulfill the world language requirement by completing: - 101 and 102 of a modern or classical language. - score of 4 or higher on the AP Latin exam
