- NOTES:
1. JUNIOR YEAR or SEMESTER ABROAD requires alternate planning, which must be done well in advance.
  2. EDUC 307 is only offered fall semester; FREN 362 is only offered spring semester.
  3. Student teaching may be either in the first or second semester; when possible, make either semester of senior year available for student teaching. All EDUC courses with the exception of EDUC 488, must be completed prior to student teaching.

**Essential information:** French 101-102 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. The French major with K-12 certification requires 32 credit hours of French beyond the elementary level. A student with prior experience in French may be eligible to begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.

\*Note: No college credits are earned when a student places out of a language course. In the event a student places out of a course, the credits currently assigned to world language study for FREN 101 and 102 must be fulfilled through general electives of the student's choosing. For FREN 201 and 202, see note in the French Core Requirements section.
