We also strongly recommend that you complete the history sequence (PHIL 231, 232, 233) prior to taking the area sequence (311, 312, 313, 314).

Please note that juniors and seniors have the opportunity to engage in independent research.

*Note: No college credits are earned when a student places out of a language course. In the event a student places out of a course, the credits currently assigned to world language study must be fulfilled through general electives of the student's choosing.
