A student with prior experience in Spanish may be eligible to begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.

*Note: No college credits are earned when a student places out of a language course. In the event a student places out of a course, the credits currently assigned to world language study for SPAN 101 and 102 must be fulfilled through general electives of the student's choosing.
