1. JUNIOR YEAR or SEMESTER ABROAD requires alternate planning, which must be done well in advance.
 2. EDUC 307 is only offered fall semester; SPAN 362 is only offered spring semester.
 3. Student teaching may be either in the first or second semester; when possible, make either semester of senior year available for student teaching. All EDUC courses with the exception of EDUC 488, must be completed prior to student teaching.

Essential information: Spanish 101-102 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. The Spanish with K-12 certification requires 35 credit hours of Spanish beyond the elementary level. A student with prior experience in Spanish may be eligible to begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.

*Note: No college credits are earned when a student places out of a language course. In the event a student places out of a course, the credits currently assigned to world language study for SPAN 101 and 102 must be fulfilled through general electives of the student's choosing.
